

Cultuurpark Westergasfabriek AMSTERDAM | 2006

Westergasfabriek, a nineteenth-century gas production plant on the outskirts of central Amsterdam, halted operations in 1981 and the site was re-zoned as a recreation space. The project was won in collaboration with Francine Houben of Mecanoo architects in 1997 and developed a concept of reuse and change within the sites existing buildings and landscape. The work began immediately to translate the 'Changement' concept into the detailed design that was completed in 2004.

Cultuurpark Westergasfabriek is one of Gustafson Porter + Bowman's defining projects and is considered a model of brownfield reclamation within a physically dense urban context and a complex set of stakeholders. Using 'Changement' as a foundation, the scheme establishes a delicate balance between buildings and landscape, contamination and accessibility, invention and interpretation, restoration and revelation that exploit the potential of the post-productive site.

Today it is a vibrant cultural center for the arts within an ecologically sustainable environment, that is also a meeting place for surrounding communities. The success of the project can be attributed to an effective design process which incorporated public input and site-specificity from its beginnings. The process of design included a full year of well-organized public consultation that led to an inventive layering of public space, with program's that suited both the arts and local communities. Providing spaces for large city events within a network of intimate natural landscaped environments.
